# **Anson County Receives Funding for Electric Charging Station**

Anson County recently installed a new electric vehicle charging station after qualifying for funding provided through the Volkswagen Group settlement program. The charging station will help to increase the clean transportation infrastructure investment in the state, which is especially important in underserved counties such as Anson County. The <u>Centralina Clean Fuels Coalition</u> assisted Anson County with their grant application and emphasized the infrastructure's role in bolstering economic investment in the county.

## Safe Streets 4 All (SS4A) Grant

The SS4A program supports the development of acomprehensive safety action plan that identifies the most significant roadway safety concerns in a community and the implementation of projects and strategies to address those issues. The program provides funding for two types of grants: Planning and Demonstration Grants and Implementation Grants. Both have their own unique deadlines.

Deadline #1 for Planning and Demonstration Grants is April 4, 2024. Click here for more information on the program and how to apply.

## **Active Transportation Infrastructure Investment Program**

This competitive Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) grant program focuses on building networks of connected bicycle and pedestrian infrastructure improvements, including providing better trail networks

between communities. As part of the program, FHWA will award competitive grants to help communities plan, design or construct safe and connected active transportation networks, such as sidewalks, bikeways and trails. These essential networks help connect residents to popular destinations, such as schools, workplaces, residences, businesses, recreation areas and medical facilities within a community or metropolitan region.

#### Final Application Deadline: June 17, 2024
